During the weekend there are discussions of poetry and works of nonfiction, drama, and fiction.

We'll kick off this Asilomar weekend with an evening of intense and challenging poetry discussions featuring works by **Lisel Mueller**, **Constantine P. Cavafy**, **Walt Whitman**, and **Wisława Szymborska**.

On Saturday morning, we'll continue with our non-fiction discussion of *The Declaration of Independence* by **Thomas Jefferson** and *Letter from Birmingham Jail* by **Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.** The combination of the 250th anniversary of

our founding principles and the continuing relevance of this treatise on their application should lead to a lively session.

These essays will also be provided in the PDF attachment with your completed registration.

Before dinner, starting at 4:30 pm, we will be having a catered *Meet & Greet* where long-time bookies can welcome new attendees, and share experiences about their local groups, and best reads while enjoying local brews, bottlings, and a generous spread of snacks.



After dinner, we'll continue with our fiction discussion with **Shirley Hazzard's** *The Transit of Venus* winner of the National Book Critics Circle Award. This novel written in exquisite prose tells the story of the displacements and absurdities of modern life experienced by two sisters across continents and decades. Considered by The Paris Review as *one of the great English-language novels of the 20th century,* discover why Shirley Hazzard is considered one of

Australia's greatest authors.



Wrapping up on Sunday morning, our play this year is *Inherit the Wind* by **Jerome Lawrence and Robert E. Lee**. Explore how this fictionalized enactment of the 1925 Scopes

Monkey trial could serve as more than the teaching of Charles Darwin's evolution theory put on trial.

The poetry and essay will be provided to you electronically once your 2-step registration is completed. We will also provide you with the specific ISBNs of the novel and play for your separate purchase. We request that everyone acquire these specific versions as consistent translations and page numbers are critical to the discussion.

Check-in begins at 4 pm on Friday at the Registration Desk. Once checked in, please pick up your conference packet at Kiln across Asilomar Ave near Sinex Ave. Underground parking near your room is free and accessible from Asilomar Ave.

Check-out time is 11 am. Please check out before the Sunday morning discussion.

If you are staying offsite, you have the option to purchase meals individually. Meal tickets must be purchased online and in advance and not on site. You will receive an email after you have successfully registered and about a month before the event with purchase instructions and prices.

Discussions will be held in groups of 10-15 attendees including one who will facilitate the discussion. All must have read the work to participate. The discussion rooms have excellent overhead lighting as two of the sessions will be after dark.
